

JOSH ARMSTRONG

Born: October 6, 1968

Residence: La Mesa, NM

Josh has been training reining and cow horses for more than 20 years. Josh has trained many horses that have earned Top 10 placings at the AQHA Championship World Show, the NRHA Futurity, the North American Reining Championships, the World Championship Reined Cow Horse Futurity and the All-American Quarter Horse Congress. He is also the first competitor to show a horse in a reining class without reins or a bridle (at the All-American Quarter Horse Congress where he is a two-time winner of the Freestyle Reining Championship). Josh started the 2010 season by competing in the Cowboy Capitol Classic with Von Reminic. In 2009, he was sixth in the CRI2* at the International Reining Festival riding Von Reminic. CASEY DEARY

Born: November 24, 1980

Residence: Weatherford, TX

Casey Deary grew up in East Texas, and at age 16 had a life-threatening fall off a young colt. Casey sustained major injuries and underwent eight facial reconstruction surgeries over three years. During high school, Casey began breaking, training and selling young reining horses and spent summers

working for James Davidson at Dick Pieper's Ranch in Purcell, OK. Upon graduation, he worked for Clint Haverty at Haverty Ranch for three years. After the 2010 NRBC, This Chicsdundreamin, ridden by Casey and owned by George Lawrence, reached a milestone of lifetime earnings of more than \$118,000 for the six-year-old mare. In 2009, Casey and Dun It At Dawn were fifth in the CRI2* at Reining by the Bay and made Top Five in the Open Derby, won the Intermediate Open Derby on Starlights Sugarwhiz and also took the Intermediate Open Reserve Champion title on This Chicsdundreamin. He was third with the Quarter Horse mare, Custom Margarita, at the 2009 USEF National Reining Championships. Casey and his wife have two sons, Wyatt and Daniel. Visit www.dearyperformance.com.

KENNETH EPPERS

Born: December 28, 1948

Residence: Crossroads, TX

Ken Eppers has had a lifelong involvement with horses. He grew up around horses at Northern Pump Farm, a working cattle farm run by his father. In the 1960s, the sport of reining became Eppers' main focus. He began to work for Dean Ames. They rode Gypsy Chips Cody and Tookies Two to AQHA Honor Roll titles. In 1999, Ken won the Saddlesmith World Championship and NRHA Reserve World Championship on Skeets Peppy. On Catomic, he won the 2002 AQHA Reserve World Champion Junior Reining title and the 2002 NRHA Derby Intermediate Open Championship. These successes have helped Ken earn more than \$225,000 in NRHA earnings. Ken began his 2010 campaign by placing ninth at the Cowboy Capitol. ANDREA FAPPANI

Born: April 1, 1977

Residence: San Marcos, CA

Originally from Italy, Andrea's Equi-Stat earnings total \$2,016,626, although his official NRHA earnings put him \$85,000 shy of becoming the newest Two Million Dollar Rider. He became an NRHA Million Dollar Rider in 2006 at age 29 (the youngest person to do so). In 2001, Andrea rode RR Star to win the NRHA Futurity. Two years later, he rode NQH Little Jac to the NRHA Futurity Reserve title. In 2005, he and Big Chex To Cash took Reserve at the Futurity. In 2005 and 2006, he rode Custom Legend to the NRBC Open Reserve Championship, and then he and the stallion returned in 2007 to win the event. In 2009, Andrea again won the NRBC, this time on Cromed Out Mercedes. He rode with Gaetan Gauthier, Craig Johnson, Todd Bergen and John Slack before becoming a professional trainer and establishing his own training facility in San Marcos, CA. OPEN REINING COMPETITORS



SHAWN FLARIDA

Born: April 30, 1969

Residence: Springfield, OH

As the NRHA's All-Time Leading Rider and it's only Three Million Dollar Rider, Shawn has made his name training some of the most talented equine athletes. He is the second person in NRHA history to reach the Two Million Dollar milestone, and he is on his way to earning Four Million Dollars (\$3.7 million and counting). In 2009, he once again captured the NRHA Open Futurity Championship; marking his fifth time. He won his first NRHA Futurity in 2002, riding Wimpys Little Step, to a record 233 score, the highest recorded for a three-year-old reiner. In 2007, he made history when he rode Wimpys Little Chic to his fourth Open championship. The win marked the first time a Futurity champion has been sired by a Futurity champion. He and "Lexi" won the NRBC, becoming the first Futurity champion to do so. Two months later, the pair won the NRHA Derby – the first pair to ever win the NRHA's top three events, reining's "Triple Crown." He is the only rider to capture both Individual and Team Gold medals at the FEI World Equestrian Games in reining (2002 – Jerez, Spain). In 2009, he won the NRHA Open Derby on RC Fancy Step. He has also won the All-American Quarter Horse Congress Open Reining Futurity eight times. Shawn and his wife, Michele, have three children – Cody (14), Courtney (8) and Sam (6). DELL HENDRICKS

Born: July 7, 1968

Residence: Tioga, TX

Born and raised in Idaho, Dell rode his first reining horse in 1991. By 2005, he had become an NRHA Million Dollar Rider. In 1998 and 2002-2005, Dell was the National Reining Breeders Classic Open Champion. He is the only individual to have won the NRBC Championship five times. The prestigious All-American Quarter Horse Congress Reining Futurity was won by Dell and Starbucks Sidekick in 2003. He has been the NRHA Derby Open Reserve Champion two times (1997, 2005). Dell won AQHA World Championship titles in 1995 on Taris Little Vintage, 2001 on Broadmoor, and an AQHA Reserve World Championship on Dunnit In Hollywood in 2002. Dell also competed in the first United States Equestrian Team (USET) Festival of Champions in 1999. He has been a member of Nations Cup Teams representing the U.S. in international reining competition earning Gold and Silver medals. In 2000 and 2002, Dell was a member of the USET Nations Cup that brought home the Gold medal. In 2003, he and Starlights Wrangler were the Individual Silver medalists at the USET Festival of Champions. In 2006, Dell and Starbucks Sidekick were members of the U.S. team at the FEI World Equestrian Games in Aachen, Germany (they won the Team Gold medal). Dell was elected as the NRHA President for the 2006 term, and he is an international clinician. Dell is married to his wife, Terri. Visit www.hendricksreininghorses.com.



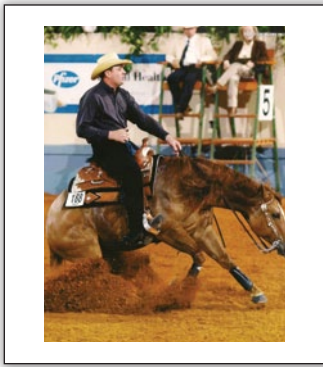
CASEY HINTON

Born: January 3, 1960

Residence: Whitesboro, TX

Casey was the Silver medalist at the 2007 FEI World Reining Masters in Oklahoma City, OK, riding Mr Boomerjac, and he was on the NRHA Top 20 Riders list for 2006-2007. Casey is a strong competitor in NRHA, AQHA and USEF competitions, and a noted coach with NRHA lifetime earnings that are nearing \$510,000. Casey was first and second at the 2007 Adequan®/USEF National Open Reining Championship qualifier in Denver, CO. At the NRBC, he was the 2007 Reserve Intermediate Open Champion and a 2007 NRHA Open Derby finalist. In 2008, Casey and Bueno Starlight represented the U.S. at the FEI World Reining Championships in Manerbio, Italy. In 2009, he finished the year as the fifth-ranked NRHA rider and owner. In addition, Casey was the Senior Reining Champion at the AQHA World Show with Smarty Starlight. He also collected Reserve Champion honors at the NRHA Futurity with Lil Magnum Jessie. In August 2009, Casey won the RMRHA Futurity and Stallion Stakes aboard Lil Magnum Jesse. Casey is married to his wife, Kathy, and he is an "r" reining judge. Visit www.cedarridgetstallions.com.

PETE KYLE

Born: September 24, 1957

Residence: Whitesboro, TX

In 2009, Pete rode Whiz's Bronze Star to the USEF Reining Open Horse of the Year title. He was also third in an international field at the FEI World Reining Masters with Whiz's Bronze Star. Pete took both the champion (Whiz's Bronze Star) and reserve champion (Gimme Major Bucks) wins at the 2009 All American Quarter Horse Congress in freestyle reining. Pete also won the CRI2* (the Tradition Futurity) on Whiz's Bronze Star. Gimme Major Bucks and Pete collected the blue ribbon in the CRI2* at the International Reining Festival. In 2008, Pete rode A Bueno Poco Dunit at the FEI World Reining Championships in Manerbio, Italy, where the U.S. team took home a Team Silver medal (Pete finished in sixth). In 2001, he was on the U.S. Nations Cup team that won a Silver medal, and that same year, Pete won the NRHA Open World Championship aboard Dun It The Hardway. Pete was the 1997 AQHA Professional Horseman of the Year, and he is a five-time USEF Gold-medal winner in the freestyle. Pete is an AQHA and NRBC director. 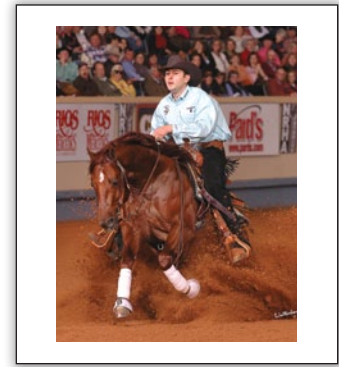


JORDAN LARSON

Born: March 21, 1981

Residence: Aubrey, Texas

With earnings amassing over a half-million dollars (NRHA) and an Individual Gold-medal title, Jordan is quickly becoming one of the best-known reining horse trainers. He is a multiple Open finalist at the NRBC, the NRHA Derby and Futurity. He is also a two-time NRBC Mare Bonus Champion, American Paint Horse World Champion, NRHA Limited Open World Champion, USEF Champion, as well as many others. Jordan has been the youngest rider to be in the Top 20 NRHA Professionals for the past four years. He is also an NRHA judge. Jordan was tied for Reserve Open Champion, as well as Mare Bonus Champion at the NRBC riding Stop Like A Dream. He was seventh in the Open Finals on Moonshine N Juice, Champion in the \$25,000 Open class on Out Shining Wimpy and was FEI Silver medalist on Make It With A Twist. His total winnings at the 2010 NRBC exceeded \$105,000. In 2008, Jordan and Lena Gallo were members of the U.S. team and took home a Team Silver medal at the FEI World Reining Championships in Manerbio, Italy. JARED LECLAIR

Born: May 28, 1980

Residence: Pilot Point, TX

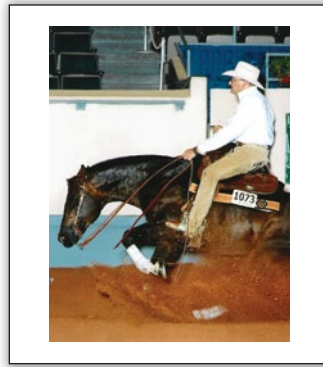
Originally from Lowell, MA, Jared started reining with his uncle as a youth. After high school, Jared attended the University of Findlay in Ohio. In 2001, he won the IHSA Individual Reining National Championship. Jared accepted a training position at Quarter Mount Farm in Paxton, MA, the home of Custom Crome. In January 2004, Jared took an assistant trainer's position under Tim McQuay. Jared found great success in competition from 2003 through 2008 in various Open events. In January 2007, he left McQuay Stables and opened Leclair Performance Horses. In 2009, Jared rode Electric Code to the Open Derby Championship at the Gordyville Breeders Classic. He won both divisions of the Novice Horse Open at the NRBC and qualified two horses for the NRHA Derby Open division finals. He finished Top 10 in the Open Derby finals on Electric Code. At the AQHA World Show, he finished Top 10 in the Junior Reining on Wimpys Little Play and in the Senior Reining on Stoned Chick. Also at the World Show, he captured the reserve championship in the FEI/USEF qualifier aboard Stoned Chick. In 2010 at the Gordyville Breeders Cup, Jared and Electric Code finished in the Top Five of the Open division. Once again, he captured both divisions of the Novice Horse Open at the NRBC on two separate horses: She Supreme Chic and Whiz N Guns. Jared is married to his wife, Heather. MANDY McCUTCHEON

Born: October 20, 1976

Residence: Aubrey, TX

Mandy is the only female and Non Pro to reach NRHA Million Dollar status. Her father is the NRHA's second all-time leading rider, Tim McQuay. Tom McCutcheon, another NRHA Million Dollar rider, is her husband. Her mother, Colleen, is a well-respected trainer of hunter/jumpers. Her parents owned the legendary Hollywood Dun It and Gunner. Mandy and Tom started their breeding program with Smart Starbuck, another NRHA Million Dollar Sire. Mandy won top ribbons as a junior rider, including Reserve Champion Large Junior Hunter and Pennsylvania National Horse Show Winners Stake Champion, as well as the Individual Bronze medal and Team Silver on her jumper. In 1989, Mandy showed her first Futurity horse, and in 1993, she won her first NRHA Non Pro Futurity Championship on Hollywood Striker. In 1994, she repeated that win on Mi Hollywood Darlin. It would be 11 more years before she would win the Futurity again in 2005 on Rawhides Banjo. In 2007, Mandy began a three-peat run at the Futurity with Haidachino Hollywood. She won it in 2008 on Smart Scat, and in 2009 on West Coast Mizzen. This tied her with NRHA Hall of Famer Bob Loomis for the most NRHA Futurity Championships. She's also won the NRHA Derby five times and the National Reining Breeders Classic four times. In 2000, Mandy and Tom welcomed their first child, Cade, and in 2005, their daughter, Carlee.

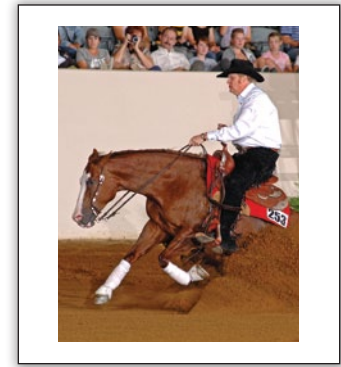


SCOTT McCUTCHEON

Born: May 12, 1955

Residence: Whitesboro, TX

Scott was raised in River Falls, WI, one of four brothers all of whom are in the horse industry. His father, Bob McCutcheon, a cutting and reining horse trainer, sparked his passion for training reining horses. After going to college and playing football, Scott and his wife of 35 years, Kathy, started a training operation in Eau Claire, WI. In 1988, they moved to Texas with their three daughters. Scott is very active in promoting all aspects of reining, donating his time to youth and Non Pro clinics. He stands three reining stallions (Mega Jac, Inwhizable and Custom Tuxedo) and heads up a complete training, breeding and instruction facility. Scott has amassed numerous championships in the APHA, AQHA and NRHA arenas. He is a seven-time Quarter Horse and Paint Horse World Champion, NRHA Open Derby Champion, NRHA Open Reserve Futurity Champion, SWRHA Open Futurity Champion and NCRHA Open Futurity and Derby Champion. In 2000, Scott and Mega Jac were the USET Individual and Team Gold medalists. The next year, Scott was a member of the Silver-medal reining World Nations Cup Team in Kreuth, Germany. 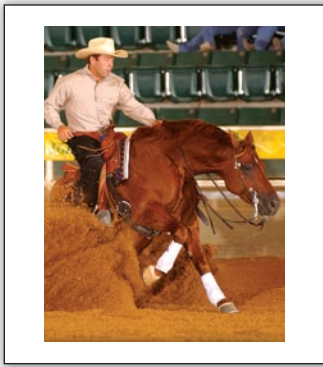
TOM McCUTCHEON

Born: March 27, 1967

Residence: Aubrey, TX

Listed as one of the horse world's leading riders, Tom McCutcheon has NRHA earnings of over \$1 million. He is a member of an elite group of Million Dollar Riders. Tom is a multiple NRHA Futurity finalist and has twice earned the NRHA Derby Reserve Championship, and is a four-time Reserve Champion at the Gordyville Breeders Cup. He is a past NRBC Open Champion, as well as a two-time USEF Open Finals Reining Champion. Tom was a member of the first U.S. team to represent reining at the 2002 FEI World Equestrian Games in Jerez, Spain, where the team brought home the Gold, and Tom brought home an Individual Silver medal. In 2008, Tom and Ruf Hearted Jac were members of the Silver medal-winning team at the FEI World Reining Championship in Manerbio, Italy. In 2009, Tom won the Individual Finals aboard Darlins Not Painted at the Kentucky Cup (a 2010 FEI Alltech World Equestrian Games™ test event). Tom is a founding Board of Directors member of the NRBC, the largest added money reining event in history. He is a member of the USEF Board of Directors and multiple NRHA committees. 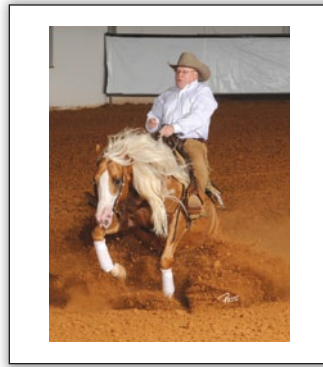


MIKE McENTIRE

Born: July 7, 1964

Residence: Selma, NC

Mike is involved in all aspects of the reining world—training, breeding and showing. He is also an NRHA and USEF judge. Mike has won many NRHA World Championships and Futurity Championships. At this time, he has more than \$600,000 in NRHA lifetime earnings. Mike has been ranked a Top 20 NRHA Professional Rider every year since the beginning of the program. He has ridden in the Futurity finals for six years. In 2004, he won the prestigious All American Quarter Horse Congress on Hot Smokin Chex and was third in the NRHA Futurity on the horse. In 2006, he finished third with Great Guntini in the Futurity Open. Mike was also a Futurity finalist in 2007 and 2009 with two horses. With Lil Ruf Rider, Mike had a strong 2009 campaign in USEF events. At the Ariat® Reining Classic, the pair were fifth in the CR12*. Later that same month, Mike and Lil Ruf Rider were third in Lexington, KY. Mike's wife, Nathalie, is a breeding manager with a lifetime of experience in stallion and mare management. TIM McQUAY

Born: April 1, 1952

Residence: Tioga, TX

Tim got started in reining in the 1970s and earned his first NRHA prize money in 1978. He became the first Two Million Dollar Rider in NRHA history, and the all-time leading earner for 11 years. Tim has won every major NRHA-sanctioned event. In the past 31 years, Tim has earned reining prize money on an astounding 229 different horses. In 2000, he was inducted into the NRHA Hall of Fame. In 2001, despite being sidelined mid-year with a life-threatening illness, he was an NRHA Futurity Finalist on Smart Miss Marker owned by Kanjiro Tokita. Literally, everywhere in the world of reining, Tim has left his mark. He is a five-time All American Quarter Horse Congress Futurity Champion and a four-time Southwest Reining Horse Association Futurity Champion. He is also a two-time AQHA World Champion and has multiple NRHA World and Reserve World Champion titles. Tim won a Silver medal at the FEI Masters Reining in Italy in 2005, riding Mister Montana Nic, and then won the Reining Masters at the NRHA Futurity that same year. In 2005, he finished in the Top Five at the NRHA Futurity on Great King Pine, one of his three horses in the finals. In 2006, Tim traveled to the FEI World Equestrian Games and earned Team Gold and Individual Silver medals on Mister Nicadual. MATTHEW MILLS

Matt and Easy Otie Whiz were the 2006 Adequan®/USEF National Reining Open Champions, where the 2006 U.S. Reining Team was selected. Matt was the youngest rider to represent the United States in reining at the 2006 FEI World Equestrian Games in Aachen, Germany, where the team won the Gold medal. Born and raised in Southern California, Matt has been riding horses since he was nine years old. His successful reining horse operation is located in Scottsdale, AZ. Matt and his wife, Karen, have three children—Alec, Emma and Ryan. In addition to training Futurity and Derby horses, Matt coaches a talented group of Non Pro and youth riders who are top competitors.
