Part II - Code of Conduct

**INTRODUCTION**

Serving as a Delegation Member for the United States Olympic Team (Team) competing in the 2008 Olympic Games (Games) is an honor. It is a distinction few achieve and an accomplishment universally recognized. I understand that the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) sends the US Delegation and the Team to the Games. It is in that context that I make the pledge set forth below to the USOC.

**DELEGATION MEMBER PLEDGE**

I pledge to uphold the spirit of this Code of Conduct (Code), which offers a general guide to my conduct as a member of the US Delegation. I hereby acknowledge that I have been informed that the attached Grievance Procedures and the USOC Bylaws provide me with the right to a hearing if my opportunity to participate is denied for any reason or if I am charged with any violation of the Code.

By signing the Code, I (1) accept nomination and, if accepted, selection to the US Delegation, (2) agree to abide by this Code and the attached Grievance Procedures, which will be used by the USOC to resolve any alleged violations of the Code, (3) agree to submit any dispute that arises in relation to my nomination or selection to the US Delegation pursuant to the Grievance Procedures, and (4) acknowledge that the Code and the Grievance Procedures apply as early as my nomination to the USOC and that violations of the Code can be based on conduct occurring prior to my selection to the US Delegation.

I have familiarized myself with the Code and understand that acceptance of its provisions as written is a condition of my selection to the US Delegation. **THIS CODE OF CONDUCT MUST BE SIGNED IN AN UNALTERED FORM IN ALL APPLICABLE PLACES IN ORDER FOR AN INDIVIDUAL TO BECOME A MEMBER OF THE US DELEGATION.**

**As a Member of the US Delegation, I hereby promise and agree that I:**

- have abided by all rules related to the procedures for selection to the US Delegation as determined by my National Governing Body (NGB) and approved by the USOC or as determined by the USOC;
- have acted and will act in a sportsmanlike manner consistent with the spirit of fair play and responsible conduct;
- will not aid any athlete in committing a doping violation as defined by the World Anti-doping Agency (WADA), United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA), my International Federation (IF), the International Olympic Committee (IOC), or USOC rules;
- will not engage in any conduct that is criminal under any laws applicable to me, including, but not limited to laws governing the possession and use of drugs and alcohol and providing of drugs to any person and of alcohol to minors;
- will not participate or assist in any gambling or betting activities associated with any event related to the Games;
- am in possession of a valid USA passport that will not expire prior to six months following the Closing Ceremonies of the Games;
- will refrain from conduct detracting from my ability or that of the US Delegation or Team to perform at the highest level possible;
- will respect the property of others whether personal or public;
- will respect members of the US Delegation, the Team, other teams, spectators and officials, and will not engage in any form of discriminatory behavior or verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse;
- will abide by the IOC Charter currently in force for the Games;
- will in-process and out-process with the USOC in conjunction with my sport, and will attend any USOC pre-briefing or post-briefing sessions, unless granted written authorization by the USOC Chef de Mission, or his or her designee;
- am aware that USOC sponsors, suppliers and licensees provide critical support for the Team and, in recognition of this fact, I will wear designated USOC apparel at (1) all official Games functions and events, including Opening and Closing Ceremonies; and (2) at media events (including press conferences) hosted by the USOC, IOC or the Organizing Committee for the XXIX Olympic Games Beijing 2008 (BOCOG); I also understand that the USOC strongly encourages me to wear designated USOC apparel

whenever possible, and that I will be expected to wear designated USOC apparel at USOC hospitality functions;

- will not conceal or cover-up any USOC sponsor, supplier or licensee brand or other identification appearing on my delegation apparel during Opening and Closing Ceremonies or at any other function or event where designated USOC apparel is required;
- will not use, or authorize the use of my name, person, image, picture, voice, or any of my sports performances for advertising or promotional purposes during the Games period without the prior written consent of the USOC;
- will not use or authorize the use of the following items for the purpose of trade, without the prior written consent of the USOC (which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld) (1) photographs, films, videos, or other images of myself in the apparel or equipment provided by the USOC for the Games; (2) photographs, films, videos, or other images of myself from the Games; (3) any Games medals; and (4) photographs, films, videos, or other images of myself with any Games medals;
- will not act as a journalist, media liaison or in any other media capacity during the period of the Games;
- will attempt to participate in media and sponsor-related activities if compatible with my schedule, when requested by the USOC Chef de Mission, or his or her designee;
- will act in a way that will bring respect and honor to myself, my teammates, the USOC, my NGB, the United States and the Games;
- understand that if I require legal representation because I am accused of a doping violation or am accused of criminal misconduct, or if for any other reason I require the services of an attorney, I will be personally responsible for payment of all such legal fees and expenses; and
- will remember that at all times I am an ambassador for my sport, my country and the Olympic Games Movement.

Part III - Grievance Procedures  
2008 Olympic Games

**INTRODUCTION**

These Procedures shall be followed in (1) disputes concerning selection to and participation in the 2008 Olympic Games (Games) and (2) grievances concerning Code of Conduct (Code) violations. These Procedures are a component of the Code and are established to ensure a fair and impartial procedure for the hearing of all such disputes and grievances. For the purposes of these Procedures references to "Team" includes all individuals who are athlete members, coaches, team leaders, administrators and officials of the Team.

**JURISDICTION**

The USOC has exclusive jurisdiction:

- 1) over a dispute concerning selection to and participation in the Games (a) after an individual has been nominated to the USOC for the Team, except that jurisdiction shall not commence prior to June 24, 2008, the time when the USOC shall accept nominations, and (b) in no event later than July 9, 2008; and,
- 2) over a Code of Conduct violation (a) after an individual has signed the Code and been nominated to the USOC for the Team, except that jurisdiction shall not commence prior to June 24, 2008 the time when the USOC shall accept nominations; and (b) in no event later than July 9, 2008.

Notwithstanding the above, jurisdiction may be authorized prior to July 24, 2008 by the USOC Chief Executive Officer (CEO), provided such permission is granted in writing.

Any Complaint filed under these Procedures must be filed within 60 days of the Closing Ceremonies of the Games.

An individual does not have standing to file a Complaint under these Procedures concerning his/her selection to and participation in the Games if the claim:

- 1) involves an anti-doping rule violation that has previously been adjudicated against the individual by the United States Anti-Doping Agency; or,
- 2) involves the final decision of a referee (any individual with discretion to make field of play decisions) during a competition regarding a field of play decision (a matter set forth in the rules of the competition to be within the discretion of the referee), unless the decision is (a) outside the authority of the referee to make or (b) the product of fraud, corruption, partiality or other misconduct of the referee.

<b>FILING A COMPLAINT</b>
---------------------------

The following individuals shall have the authority to file a complaint under these Procedures:

- 1) an athlete, coach, trainer, manager, administrator or official who was a participant in the events designated as the final selection process (Olympic Games Trials) and who believes he or she has been wrongfully denied the opportunity to participate in the Games; and,
- 2) the USOC Chef de Mission, the USOC Chair, the USOC CEO, a team leader of the Team, an athlete member of the Team, or a coach of the Team who believes that a violation of the Code has occurred.

A Complaint filed pursuant to these Procedures shall be in writing and signed by the Complainant. It shall be filed with the USOC CEO, or his/her designee, with a copy to the USOC General Counsel. The Complaint may be filed by hand, mail, overnight courier, facsimile or electronic mail. However, to ensure delivery and have proof of filing the Complainant must request and receive a written notice from the USOC CEO, or his/her designee, confirming receipt of the Complaint.

The Complaint shall set forth:

- 1) the names of the parties (the Complainant and Respondent);
- 2) the jurisdictional basis of the Complaint;
- 3) a concise statement of the factual allegations, including the basis upon which (a) the Complainant was denied selection to or participation in the Games, or (b) the Respondent has violated the Code;
- 4) the names of all persons that may be adversely affected by the Complaint; and,
- 5) the relief sought.

A person notified of a filing of a Complaint who may be adversely affected under these Procedures shall have the option to participate in an arbitration before the American Arbitration Association (AAA) as a party. A person so notified shall be bound by the decision of the Arbitrator regardless of the person's decision to participate.

### **PROCESSING THE COMPLAINT**

Upon receipt of the Complaint, the USOC CEO, or his/her designee, shall promptly:

- 1) send the Complainant written notice confirming receipt of the Complaint;
- 2) send to any individual or organization who is named by the Complainant, or that the USOC determines may be adversely affected, a copy of the Complaint, an invitation to respond in writing to the Complaint, and a copy of these Procedures; and,
- 3) notify the USOC Chef de Mission, the Chair of the USOC Athletes' Advisory Council, all affected NGB Team Leader(s), the USOC Delegation Director, and the USOC Athlete Ombudsman of the Complaint and provide them with a copy of the Complaint.

### **INVESTIGATION OF THE COMPLAINT**

Upon receipt of the Complaint, the USOC CEO, or his/her designee, shall cause an investigation to be made as to the allegations set forth in the Complaint.

The undersigned hereby agrees to fully cooperate in the investigation described above, including by facilitating the collection of all relevant documents and participating in interviews. Failure to cooperate may be commented upon, and form the basis for an adverse determination, at any hearing.

### **RESOLUTION OF THE COMPLAINT**

Following submission of the Complaint, the USOC CEO, or his/her designee, shall attempt to resolve the dispute to the satisfaction of the parties. Any agreed-upon resolution must include the written acknowledgment by the parties of that resolution. An athlete may consult with the USOC Athlete Ombudsman at any time.

### **GAMES ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD HEARING**

In disciplinary matters arising out of the Code, the Games Administrative Board shall hear the Complaint. In such cases, the USOC shall notify the parties of the hearing date, time and place. The Complainant shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to present any evidence or argument in support of the Complaint. The Respondent shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to present any evidence or argument in the Respondent's defense. The Games Administrative Board shall inform the parties of its decision in writing. The Games Administrative Board may impose any penalty it considers appropriate, including those penalties listed in these Grievance Procedures.

The Respondent may appeal any decision made by the Games Administrative Board to the AAA.

Notwithstanding the above, the Respondent may bypass the Games Administrative Board hearing and file a demand immediately with the AAA.

### **AAA HEARING**

A party to the dispute may at any time file a claim with the AAA for resolution, except that in disciplinary matters, only the Respondent may file a claim with the AAA. An Arbitration brought pursuant to these procedures shall be conducted according to the Commercial Rules of the AAA, as modified, if at all, in accordance with the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act. The AAA Rules shall be readily available from the USOC Chef de Mission, the USOC CEO, or his/her designee, the USOC Athletes' Advisory Council athlete representatives at the Games and the USOC Athlete Ombudsman. If notified, the undersigned hereby agrees to appear and testify at any hearing conducted pursuant to these Procedures.

### **DECISION**

The AAA Arbitrator shall provide a written decision setting forth the reasons for the Arbitrator's decision. The Arbitrator shall send the decision to the parties and to the USOC CEO.

The decision of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding on all parties.

The USOC Athlete Ombudsman shall be available to answer questions regarding athlete rights.

### **PENALTIES**

The Arbitrator, after consulting with the USOC or others of the Arbitrator's choosing, may impose any penalty deemed appropriate for a Code violation, including, but not limited to:

- 1) expulsion from the Team and mandated return home or away from official Team areas, regardless of whether or not the Team member's competition has taken place;
- 2) recommendation to the National Governing Body (NGB) and the USOC of the loss of privilege to participate in future Olympic, Paralympic, Pan American, and Parapan American Games, as well as other USOC sponsored events;

- 3) denial of funding from the USOC Athlete Support Programs or other USOC sponsored programs for which the Team member may be eligible;
- 4) restriction of the Team member to his/her room or other controlled area(s);
- 5) return of the Team member's equipment, uniform and all other attire provided as a part of the Team;
- 6) performance of a specified task or tasks, such as a formal written and/or oral apology or restitution;
- 7) denial of the privilege to march or otherwise participate in Opening and/or Closing Ceremonies; and,
- 8) revocation of Athletes' Village visitor privileges.

**This form must be executed without alteration in order for an individual to be eligible to participate at the 2008 Olympic Games.**

**AUTHORIZATION FOR SERVICES**

I hereby give consent for the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) to provide me with medical care and treatment and emergency medical services associated with participation in the 2008 Olympic Games. Additionally, I hereby agree if I elect to obtain any of these services or treatments from any sources other than those provided, or approved by the USOC, I shall accept full and complete responsibility, including any financial obligations.

I further authorize the release of any medical information necessary to process a claim for accident/medical payment insurance for an injury or illness incurred while I am participating as a member of the USOC Official Delegation at the 2008 Olympic Games.

**DELEGATION INSURANCE**

The USOC maintains an accident medical policy including coverage for Accidental Death and Dismemberment for all registered athlete and certified members of the United States delegation (e.g. coaches and team leaders). All benefits are payable on an EXCESS BASIS. This means any other insurance – your personal policy, an employer policy, a parent’s policy, etc. – under which you are named must pay or deny payment on each bill before the USOC insurance will consider payment. The maximum benefit amount is \$25,000, with sub limits of \$2,500 for physiotherapy and \$1,000 for chiropractic services. The policy also has a \$250 per incident deductible.

Coverage commences at the time the person leaves his/her residence, place of employment, training site, or such similar location, whichever occurs last, for the immediate purpose of joining the Delegation. Coverage continues until such time as an individual returns to his/her residence, place of employment, training site, or such similar location, provided that the individual proceeds directly from the Game site to such destination. Otherwise, coverage is terminated once an individual’s responsibilities at the Games are concluded.

Benefits in the event of death will be paid to the insured person's estate, unless the below beneficiary information designating a beneficiary and his/her relationship to the insured person is filed with the USOC. Information concerning insurance coverage and beneficiary designation must be provided on Attachment A.

<b>MEDIA RELEASE AND LICENSE</b>
----------------------------------

I hereby agree to be filmed, videotaped and photographed, and to have my image and voice otherwise recorded, in any media, during the Games by the USOC, by the USOC's official photographer(s), film crew(s) and video crew(s), and by any other entity authorized by the USOC, under the conditions specified by the USOC, the International Olympic Committee (IOC), or the Organizing Committee for the XXIX Olympic Games Beijing 2008 (BOCOG).

I hereby grant the USOC the irrevocable, perpetual, fully paid-up, worldwide right and license to use, and to authorize third parties to use, in all media, my name, picture, likeness, voice and biographical information for: (1) news and information purposes, (2) promotion of the Games and the specific competition(s) in which I compete, (3) promotion of the Team, and (4) promotion of the USOC and the Olympic Movement in the United States, whether commercial or noncommercial; provided that, in no event may the USOC use or authorize the use of my name, picture, likeness, voice and biographical information in any manner that would imply my endorsement of any company, product, or services, without my written permission.

<b>WAIVER AND RELEASE</b>

**Note: This form must be read and signed in unaltered form before the participant is allowed to take part in any travel, training, competition, meeting or testing sessions as a member of the Delegation. By signing this form, the participant affirms having read and understood it.**

In consideration of my involvement at the 2008 Olympic Games under the auspices of the United States Olympic Committee acknowledge, appreciate and agree that:

I risk bodily injury, including paralysis, dismemberment, disability and death, and while particular rules of the sport, equipment, and discipline may reduce this risk, this risk of injury does exist, as well as the risk of damage to or loss of property;

I knowingly and freely assume all such risk, both known and unknown, even if arising from the negligence of the releasees or others;

I willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation;

I, for myself, and on behalf of my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby release, hold harmless and promise not to sue the USOC or my National

Governing Body (NGB) and their respective sponsors, officers, volunteers, staff, and/or agents (all referred to as "releasees"), with respect to any and all such injury and loss arising from my participation, whether caused by the negligence of the releasees or otherwise, except that which is the result of gross negligence or willful misconduct of the releasees, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Part V – Background Check Requirement

**INTRODUCTION**

In order to ensure a safe team environment at the 2008 Olympic Games (Games), the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) requires that: i) all official Games delegation staff members (coaches, team leaders, additional officials, etc.) who receive a non-athlete “A” accreditation issued by the Organizing Committee for the Games; ii) all personal coaches who receive a “P” accreditation issued by the Organizing Committee for the Games; iii) all individuals who are not official Games delegation staff members, but who are assigned by the USOC to serve in Games roles; and iv) all other individuals who the USOC determines, in its sole discretion, should receive background checks shall undergo a background check. The Background Check Requirements do not apply to athletes. All background checks will be conducted by the National Center for Safety Initiatives (NCSI).

**AGREEMENT**

In order that a background check can be conducted on me, I agree to follow all procedures for authorizing NCSI to conduct the check. These procedures include going to NCSI’s website, [www.safetyinitiatives.com](http://www.safetyinitiatives.com), and filling out my name, social security number and other required information. If I do not have access to the internet, I may provide the necessary information and authorization to NCSI in writing. NCSI’s telephone number is (866) 833-7100.

I will submit all information to NCSI myself, and will not ask, authorize or allow any other person to submit information on my behalf. In providing information to NCSI, I certify that all of the statements on my application and all of the information that I provide are true and complete to the best of my knowledge. Further, I will cooperate in any way necessary to ensure that NCSI can conduct a complete and accurate background check.

## BACKGROUND CHECK

All background checks shall consist of NCSI's "Full Service Check-it-Twice™" package, which includes:

- checks of two independent national databases;
- checks of all available state sex offender registries;
- Social Security number and address verification;
- federal terrorist database check;
- checks of county criminal records by county courthouse runners for each county where the individual currently lives or has lived during the past seven years, going back the length of time records are available for each county searched;
- international background checks for countries where the individual has lived, worked, or studied for three or more consecutive months during the past seven years; and
- motor vehicle records check.

In addition, NCSI will perform a limited automatic recheck 12 months after the initial background check on active individuals. The recheck will include checks of one national database, all available state sex offender registries, and motor vehicle records.

NCSI will issue its findings based on a "Red Light/Green Light" system. A "Green Light" or "meets the criteria" finding indicates the individual is suitable for Games roles with regard to the background check. A "Red Light" finding means that the individual "does not meet the criteria" and is not suitable for Games roles with regard to the background check.

A record or disclosure from the individual that contains the following information will be flagged as a "Red Light" or "does not meet the criteria:"

- any felony (any crime punishable by confinement of greater than one year);
- any lesser crime involving force or threat of force against a person;
- any lesser crime in which sexual relations is an element, including "victimless" crimes of a sexual nature (including pornography);
- any lesser crime involving controlled substances (not paraphernalia or alcohol);
- any lesser crime involving cruelty to animals; or,
- any sex offender registrant.

Additionally, the following information will result in further investigation involving the individual and the appropriate courts, which will lead to a determination of either a "Red Light" or a "Green Light" finding:

- an arrest of one or more of the criterion offenses with no disposition noted;
- expunctions, restoration of rights, or pardons of a criterion offense;

- any charge involving a child resulting in a disposition favorable to the applicant; or,
- an arrest or conviction where it is not readily apparent if drugs or alcohol are involved.

The above criteria, are contained within the guidelines developed by the National Council of Youth Sports (NCYS), and have been adopted by NCSI. The NCYS considers that the criteria for a “Red Light” or “does not meet the criteria” finding to be consistent with the principles of the federal PROTECT Act of 2003.

I understand that when my background check is conducted and there is a “Red Light” finding as to the criteria listed above, my National Governing Body or the USOC may determine that I am not suitable to serve at the 2008 Olympic Games.

#### **DRIVING PRIVILEGES**

For purposes of being authorized to drive any motor vehicle on USOC business, a record or disclosure from the applicant that contains the following information will be flagged as a “Red Light” or “does not meet the criteria:”

- a suspended or revoked driver's license;
- more than two moving violations and/or accidents in the past two years;
- any major conviction within the past two years, including, but not necessarily limited to: DUI/DWI, possession of an open container, any drug-related motor vehicle incident, leaving the scene of an accident, assault (in any form) by use of a motor vehicle, reckless driving (willful or wanton disregard for safety of persons or property in any form); and
- individual being under 21 years of age.

I understand that when my background check is conducted and there is a “Red Light” finding as to the above criteria, I will not be allowed to drive a motor vehicle at the Games.

#### **RIGHT TO A HEARING**

Should an individual contest an NGB’s decision not to nominate him or her as a Games delegation staff member, based on a “Red Light” finding, the individual has the right to a hearing pursuant to the NGB’s internal grievance process, or pursuant to Article IX of the USOC Bylaws that allows the individual to file a demand for arbitration with the American Arbitration Association (AAA).

Should an individual contest the USOC’s decision not to accept a nomination as a Games delegation staff member, based on a “Red Light” finding, the individual has the right to a hearing before a USOC Review Panel, as set forth in the USOC Background Check

Policy. If the individual disagrees with the finding of the Review Panel, the individual may file a demand for arbitration with the AAA. A decision rendered by the AAA on the USOC's decision not to accept a nomination shall be final and binding on all parties.

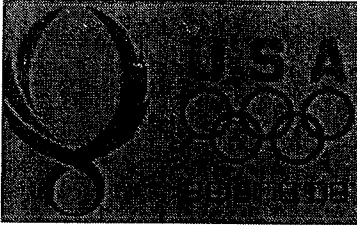

In order to apply for your background check you must come to the website and enter your information through the Self Registration portion of the website. Through this process you will be asked to provide personal information as well as authorization and consent to the background check therefore it is important that you submit the information yourself.

- 3) Complete the "Personal Information" section.

**Legal Name:** Input your full legal name as it appears on your birth certificate or driver's license. Using a nickname or abbreviated name will make it necessary to rerun all or part of the background check and result in delays and additional charges. - 10) This screen confirms your background check has been submitted correctly. It will also provide you with a link to your rights under the Fair Credit Report Act. Lastly, this screen assigns your Applicant ID Number. This number can be used the next time you submit your background check to automatically load your previous information into the form as well as serving as a confirmation number for your submission.
