## General Information for the North American Junior and Young Rider Championships

The North American Junior and Young Rider Championships is an international event held annually. The 2011 North American Junior and Young Rider Championships will be held at the Kentucky Horse Park July 27-31, 2011. Teams are invited from the twelve Zones in the United States, each Canadian Province, Mexico and the Caribbean to compete for team and individual medals. The Championships are designed to mirror the competition format used at the Olympic and Pan American Games. The objective of the national and international Federations is to introduce and prepare competitors for international competitions and FEI rules. In addition, the Championships offer riders the opportunity and experience of competing as a member of a team.

Eligibility: The Zone of each horse/rider combination is determined by the rider's point state as defined by JP 100.4.

### Requirements

- Application - Athletes wishing to be considered for a 2011 Zone Junior or Young Rider Show Jumping Team must complete an application. There is a separate application for the Junior Team and a separate application for the Young Rider Team. Riders wishing to apply for both may do so if eligible by age but must use BOTH applications.
  - Applications completed online have a reduced application fee of \$10 per application and an extended deadline of June 15, 2011. Online applications are updated immediately in the standings.   - Applications made by regular mail, fax, or hand delivered must be returned with an application fee of \$20 per application to the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF), Attn: Jennifer Haydon, Jumping Department, USEF, 4047 Iron Works Parkway, Lexington, KY 40511, (859)225-6911, fax (859)231-6662, [jhaydon@usef.org](mailto:jhaydon@usef.org). Applications must be postmarked, hand-delivered, or faxed on or prior to Wednesday June 8, 2011. Applications postmarked, hand-delivered, or faxed after Wednesday June 8, 2011 will not be accepted. **IN THE EVENT AN APPLICATION IS RECEIVED WITHOUT AN APPLICATION FEE, THOSE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED ONLY IF THE APPLICATION FEE IS RECEIVED BY Friday June 10, 2011.**
- **!! Updated FEI Passports including vaccination records per FEI rules are REQUIRED!!**
- FEI Registration Numbers for horse and rider are required.
- International High Performance fee is required for the rider per GR 207.1.e.
- Horses are required to have a valid Coggins test as specified by their state of origin and the state in which the Championship is held. Horses must have health documents and vaccinations as specified by their state of origin and the state in which the championship is held.
- Horses are required to have a health certificate within thirty (30) days of the competition.
- If additional inoculations are required, candidates will be notified.
- Riders must be U.S. citizens or in compliance with FEI Jumping Rules, Article 119 regarding Nationality Status of Competitors.
- Riders must be current members in good standing with USEF.

- Horses must be recorded with the Federation pursuant to USEF General Rule 1102.2 and must be shown under the correct owner of record. Per FEI Rules for Jumping Events, horses must be seven years of age or older.

### **Financial Terms**

Riders are responsible for their own expenses to the NAJYRC. However, your Zone may provide some financial reimbursement to team members or the Chef d'Equipe.

### **Drug Testing**

The North American Junior and Young Rider Championships is a drug free competition. During the NAJYRC, FEI rules will be in effect, and all horses shall be subject to drug testing. Blood and/or urine samples may be collected at any time. Samples will be tested for the presence of all forbidden and/or controlled substances using FEI guidelines. If any substance is detected for which the FEI has established quantitative restrictions, the amount of this substance will be quantified.

### **Soundness Inspection**

Because there is a mandatory veterinary inspection at the NAJYRC, your Zone's criteria may require soundness inspections (jogs) if designated selection trials are used. If a soundness inspection is required, times and locations will be announced and declared horses must be presented for at least one soundness inspection during the selection process.

### **Combining Zones to Form Teams**

If a zone is unable to field a team of at least three horse/riders combinations, the zone may apply to the Federation to combine with another zone which is also unable to field a team. Once all Definite Entries have been submitted, USEF will make the final decision to combine horse/rider combinations no later than the first Chef d'Equipe meeting.

### **Horse Substitution Request**

Horse Substitution requests will only be considered when the Zone has exhausted the list of eligible applicants available with their first ranked horse.

If an applicant's best ranked horse is not available, the applicant may request to be considered for selection on another horse. The request must be in writing to Diane Popp, USHJA Zones Manager. The request will be reviewed by the un-conflicted members of their Zone Jumper Committee or their designees, in consultation with the Zone's Junior/Young Rider Coordinator and Chef d'Equipe, if un-conflicted, whose decision and recommendation to the USHJA Officers must be unanimous. The USHJA Officers shall have the final decision.

In making their decision, the un-conflicted members of the Zone Jumper Committee or their designees shall evaluate the past performance of the horse and rider, including the ability to jump the size and difficulty of obstacles, the complexity of the course(s) and the required speed to avoid time penalties. Horses being submitted for consideration must have earned a Certificate of Capability for the appropriate level (Junior or Young Rider), though not necessarily as a combination with the applicant.

After the Definite Entry Deadline, substitutions will only be allowed in the event of an accident or illness of a competitor and/or horse on the production of a certificate from a properly licensed physician and/or with the permission of the Veterinary Commission. Substitutions must be made in ranking order from the horse/rider combinations submitted on the Zone's Nominated Entry, and must be exhausted before a Horse Substitution Request can be considered (see Horse Substitution Request above).

Between the completion of the First Veterinary Inspection and one hour before the First competition, substitutions will only apply to riders and/or reserve horses already in the Stables, and will only be allowed in the event of an accident or illness of a competitor and/or horse on the production of a certificate from a properly licensed physician and/or with the permission of the Veterinary Commission.

### **Equine Canada (EC) and Foreign FEI Competitions**

Money from EC and Foreign FEI competitions may be counted towards the horse/rider combination if the class/s meet or exceed the Zone's qualifying criteria, and are held within the Zone's qualifying period.

In addition, class/s results must be submitted as follows:

- A copy of the prize list (indicating which class is to be counted and the fence height) and the official results from the horse show/event office must be submitted to the Junior/Young Rider Zone Coordinator within five business days of the last date of the competition for the money to count and
- Junior/Young Rider Zone Coordinators must submit any updates in money won from EC and/or Foreign FEI competitions to USEF, Attention Jennifer Haydon, within five days of receipt from the rider.

EC or Foreign FEI competition money won and submitted as specified above will be converted into US dollars at the exchange rate of the date won and noted for that horse/rider in their Zones' standings.

## **The North American Young Rider Championships (CH-N.AM-YR-S):**

The Young Rider Championship is open only to Young Riders (ages 16-21) as defined by FEI rules. The Young Rider Championship team will consist of four team members and an alternate. The alternate may compete in the Championship as an Individual. The Championship features both a Team and an Individual competition. **Maximum fences heights will be 1.50m (4'11") with proportional spread between 1.50m and 1.80m (4'11" to 5'9") per FEI Jumping Rules Annex IX.** Standings for the Young Rider Championship can be found on the Federation web site at [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org) under 'Zone Points'.

### **Age of Young Rider**

Riders may compete in the CH-N.AM-YR-S (North American Young Rider Championship) from the beginning of the year they reach the age of 16 until the end of the year they reach the age of 21 per FEI General Regulations Appendix – A Definitions. This includes riders born between January 1, 1990 and December 31, 1995.

### **Certificate of Capability**

Each horse/rider combination must complete a Certificate of Capability in order to compete in the North American Young Rider Championships. A Certificate of Capability is considered complete when the horse/rider combinations completes a course set at 1.45m or higher with a score of 4 faults or less within your Zone's qualifying period. Riders must verify this in writing from the horse show office with a signed judge's card.

### **Team**

Each team will be comprised of the top four horse/rider combinations as ranked in the Zone's standings. A fifth horse/rider combination will be chosen as the alternate who will receive a place on the team in the event of illness, injury, or withdrawal of a team horse/rider. The alternate will be eligible to compete for the Individual Championship.

The following prize money credit will be given to competitors for Junior Jumper, Amateur Owner Jumper, or Open Jumper USEF Horse of the Year categories depending on rider's eligibility, even though no actual cash will be given:

## **North American Junior Championships (CH-N.AM-J-S):**

The Junior Championship is open only to Juniors (ages 14-18) as defined by the FEI rules. The Junior Championship team will consist of four team members and an alternate. The alternate may compete in the Championship as an Individual. The Championship features both a Team and an Individual competition. **Maximum fence heights will be 1.40m (4'7") with proportional spread between 1.40m to 1.70m (4'7" to 5'6").** Standings for the Junior Championship can be found on the Federation's web site at [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org) under 'Zone Points'.

### **Age of Junior**

Riders may compete in the CH-N.AM-J-S (North American Junior Championship) from the year they reach the age of 14 until the end of the year they reach the age of 18 per FEI General Regulations Appendix – A Definitions. This includes those born between January 1, 1993 and December 31, 1997.

### **Certificate of Capability**

Each horse/rider combination must complete a Certificate of Capability in order to compete in the North American Junior Championships. A Certificate of Capability is considered complete when the horse/rider combinations completes a course set at 1.40m or higher with a score of 4 faults or less within the Zone's qualifying period. Riders must verify this in writing from the horse show office with a signed judge's card.

### **Team**

Each team will be comprised of the top four horse/rider combinations as ranked in the Zone's standings. A fifth horse/rider combination will be chosen as the alternate who will receive a place on the team in the event of illness, injury, or withdrawal of a team horse/rider. The alternate will be eligible to compete for the Individual Championship.

The following prize money credit will be given to the horse for Junior Jumper USEF Horse of the Year categories even though no actual cash will be given:
