Designated qualifying competitions must be **at least a Level 3 competition** and must comply with all the outlined requirements, as well as the USEF Dressage Rules, USEF General Rules, and Selection Procedures/Qualifying Requirements that apply to these competitions.

This document serves as a resource for competition management of USEF/NAYC Dressage Qualifying Competitions and U.S. FEI Dressage Competitions. The manual is intended to provide information to USEF/NAYC Qualifying Competition management for planning purposes. The information provided is subject to change or updates.

Important Information for 2024

- <u>New this year</u> approved qualifying competitions (held between January 1, 2024, and July 22, 2024) will be <u>required</u> to host FEI World Breeding Championship classes. <u>Please see the required tests section of the manual</u>.
- Qualifying competitions that have date changes must communicate the changes to dressage@usef.org for the calendar to be updated accordingly.
- Qualifying competitions that are cancelled must email <u>dressage@usef.org</u> with detailed reasoning for the cancellation. Prior to cancelling, organizers must work with USEF Dressage Staff to resolve any issues that may lead to cancellation. If organizers do not work with USEF Dressage Staff prior to cancellation of the qualifying classes, they will not be eligible to apply for qualifying status in 2025.

<u>FEI Children, Pony Rider, Junior and Young Rider Team Tests</u>: The Team Test must be scheduled PRIOR to the Individual and Freestyle Tests. Freestyle Tests may be offered before Individual Tests. Team and Individual qualifying tests must be offered on separate days.

FEI Grand Prix, Intermediaire I, and Brentina Cup Tests:

- The Grand Prix and Special Tests must be offered on separate days.
- The Intermediate I and Prix St. Georges Tests must be offered on separate days.
- The Intermediate II and Grand Prix 16-25 Tests must be offered on separate days.

Prize List Review Procedure

Prize Lists must be submitted per normal USEF and USDF procedures. Competitions may request additional review by the Dressage Department for special USEF/NAYC Qualifying Competition requirements by submitting their prize list to festival@usef.org.

Reporting Results

Per DR 128.4, qualifying scores for USEF National Championships, including Children, Pony Riders, Juniors, Young Riders, Brentina Cup (Young Adults), Young and Developing Horse, and High Performance (Intermediate I and Grand Prix), must be submitted by Competition Management to the Federation Dressage Department within 48 hours after the competition. Exception: Competitions held at the end of the qualifying period require submission of results within 24 hours after the competition.

Guide to Hosting Para Dressage Qualifying Tests

All approved Qualifying Competitions are required to host Para Dressage Qualifying Tests.

Dispensation or Classification Certificate:

Athletes must provide Competition Management a copy of their Federation Dispensation/Classification Certificate with their entry. A copy of their Federation Dispensation/Classification Certificate must be attached to the Athlete's test for the Judge's reference.

Copies of these certificates must be attached to the judge's test copy and provided to the Technical Delegate. The ring steward should check the saddlery of one-third of the horses in each class immediately after the horse leaves the arena, in compliance with DR126.2.i.1. Any discrepancy will be reported to the Judge at C and may entail elimination. Management must provide a copy of each Athlete's Federation Dispensation/Classification Certificate to the ring stewards for all Para Athletes. See DR 308.9 and DR 119.12-DR119.1

FEI Para Dressage Tests:

- FEI Para Dressage Tests are found <u>here</u> on the FEI website. Please note: the test names have been updated, effective January 1, 2023.
- FEI Para Dressage Tests must be ridden from memory unless an exemption is listed on the athlete's Dispensation/Classification Certificate. In all tests, movements must follow the order laid down in the test. See DR122.1, DR122.4 and DR310.

Facility and Arena Requirements for Para Team, Para Individual, and Para Freestyle TOC classes:

- For designated national qualifying competitions, all tests for Grades I III must be ridden in a small arena (20m x 40m). See DR303.4.
- For designated national qualifying competitions, all tests for Grades IV V must be ridden in a standard size arena. See DR303.4.
- Restroom it is encouraged but not required to provide a minimum of one (1) accessible port-a john if onsite facilities do not have an accessible restroom.
- It is encouraged but not required to provide wheelchair accessible mounting equipment.

Scheduling of Tests:

When preparing your time schedule, consider ending the day with your Para classes in order to begin the next day with Para. This way you only need to change the arena size once a day. Most often, the support staff and families of the athletes are willing to help make any ring adjustments so do not hesitate to ask for help.

If you find that you need both the small and standard-size arenas for athletes in the same class, there are two (2) options:

1. Update your prize list to offer two separate FEI Para TOC classes.

2. Or create two separate divisions of the class.

Divisions or sections of a class are considered to be a separate "class" only if listed as such in the prize list. Divisions or sections of a class may be held in different rings and judged by different judges. When divisions or sections are held under different conditions (i.e., different ring or judges), separate awards must be given (DR126.2.3). Don't forget to send in your updated prize list to USEF! See GR904.

Dress, Saddlery, Equipment & Compensating Aids:

- Please refer to DR120.12 and DR121 for rules not specifically covered under DR306 DR308.
- Athletes must use snaffle or double bridles (DR308.1) when competing in any FEI Para Dressage Test class. However, when athletes enter an able-bodied class/test, they must provide their Dispensation/Classification Certificate in order to use their compensating aids during the test.
- Due to the complex nature of the saddlery used by some Para athletes, refer to the FEI Para Dressage Rules for any additional requirements for bits and bridles not covered in DR121. See Article 8428 of the FEI Para Dressage Rules.

The aim of the above information is to provide Competition Management a brief outline of what to expect when offering the Para Dressage Tests. It is strongly recommended for Competition Management hosting the USEF/NAYC Qualifying Tests to familiarize themselves with all USEF General and Dressage Rules.

Level of Competition and Licensing

Competitions approved as USEF/NAYC qualifiers must be licensed as **Level 3 or higher competitions**. A competition and all associated officials and staff must fully comply with the requirements of a Level 3 competition (and/or above). In addition, the correct qualifying classes must be offered. Please refer to the Required Classes and Judge Requirements section. The Level 3 competition cannot be immediately preceded by a competition of a lower level (i.e., it is not permitted to hold a Level 2 competition on a Friday and then the qualifier on Saturday and Sunday.

- All competitions must retain current and correct USEF licenses and USDF recognition.
- Competitions held over the course of a weekend are considered one qualifying opportunity, even if they have separate license/recognition numbers.

License Agreement

Competitions that are approved as USEF/NAYC qualifiers should ensure they select the correct classes when completing the USEF/USDF License Agreement.

For example, between January 1, 2024, and July 22, 2024, approved qualifying competitions would select the following:

Receipt of this application shall not be construed as a guarantee that a license will be granted (GR302). In applying for the below dates the licensee agrees to abide by the rules of the Federation and understands that failure to do so constitutes a breach of the license agreement and may constitute a violation of the rules which may subject the licensee to penalty under the provisions of GR706. Incomplete license applications and applications submitted without a completed licensee registration or accompanying fees will not be accepted.

Dressage competitions and open dressage divisions held at Regular or Local Competitions are not rated. Dressage competitions (Open to all breeds) are the ONLY competitions which may offer qualifying classes for High Performance, USEF/USDF Regional Championships, USDF Breeders Championship Series and USEF Championship programs. Regular or Local Competitions offering open or breed-restricted dressage divisions and/or classes may not offer qualifying classes for the above-listed programs.

Date and Location Changes

Modifications may be made to approved competitions, however they must be received a minimum of 12 weeks prior to the competition and are subject to approval of the Dressage Calendar Working Group. Exceptions may be made to this rule in extraordinary circumstances.

Modifications include:

- Change of Date(s) from Date(s) submitted on Application.
- Change of Venue/Location from Venue/Location submitted on Application.
- Addition of Date(s) from Date(s) submitted on Application.
- Changes of Manager/Secretary must be submitted to the USEF Competitions Department, however <u>no approval is required</u> as long as Manager/Secretary meet qualification requirements for Level 3 or above competitions.

If modifications do not follow the process outlined in the <u>Policies and Procedures</u>, the competition may be removed as a USEF/NAYC Dressage Qualifying Competition. Notice of modifications must be sent to <u>dressage@usef.org</u>.

Cancellation of a USEF/NAYC Dressage Qualifying Competition

Cancellation of any USEF/NAYC event outside of the regular Open Review period must be received in writing to the Dressage Department (dressage@usef.org) with specific reasoning concerning the cancellation. Prior to cancelling, organizers must work with USEF Dressage Staff to resolve any issues that may lead to cancellation. If organizers do not work with USEF Dressage Staff and cancel the qualifying classes, they will not be eligible to apply for qualifying status in 2025.

These Qualifying Requirements are based on the USEF and FEI rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the Qualifying Requirements caused by a change in USEF or FEI rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The Qualifying Requirements are based on the latest information available to USEF. However, the Qualifying Requirements are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.

Applicable Rules

Designated qualifying competitions must comply with all of the outlined requirements in this manual, as well as the USEF Dressage Rules, USEF General Rules, and Qualifying Requirements that apply to these competitions. Failure to comply may result in investigation, penalties, and sanctions and will affect a competition's future status as a qualifier. If you determine that your competition is unable or unwilling to comply with these requirements and would like to be removed from the official qualifying competition list, contact dressage@usef.org immediately.

- 24 Hour Rule: When qualifying for Children, Pony Riders, Juniors, Young Riders, and Brentina Cup (Young Adults), Intermediaire I, or Grand Prix within 24 hours prior and through the conclusion of the competition, any horse entered in a USEF Qualifying class shall not be ridden by anyone other than the athlete entered in that class on that horse, under penalty of disqualification from the class for USEF championship qualifying purposes. Exception: grooms riding on a loose rein. For purposes of this rule, the competition starts when horse and athlete arrive on the show grounds. This rule also applies for NAYC and USEF High Performance (HP) qualifying competitions and classes.
- **Dress:** Please refer to DR120-121 for Dress and Saddlery rules for national level competition qualifiers. For a CDI event, all FEI Dressage and General Regulations must be followed.
- Equipment:
 - Junior and Young Rider Snaffle or double bridle is permitted for USEF/NAYC qualifying classes held at a national competition or CDI.
 - Brentina Cup, Grand Prix and Intermediaire I Snaffle or double bridle is permitted for qualifying classes held at a national competition. FEI Rules are followed at a CDI.
 - Developing Horse Snaffle or double bridle is permitted for qualifying classes held at a national competition. FEI Rules are followed at a CDI.
