Elite Program - Run by USEF (funding from USEF/USET Foundation)

Goals

Provide training and funding for Elite Level Athletes/Horse Combinations for World Championship/WEG qualification and medals in the current Games cycle.

- Limited number of Athlete / Horse or Pony combinations that need management and finishing touches. Not about selecting the 'top' in the U.S. but about selecting those that are or about to be *internationally competitive* at World Championship and/or WEG Games level.
- Training sessions may be combined with developing Athletes depending on the number of Athletes currently in these programs.
- The Athletes that have the tools and attitude to win
- Identify Elite Level Athletes via Selectors with input from Coach and Chef d'Equipe. During training sessions the Coach, technical advisor and USEF Director of Driving will communicate with Selectors as to the progress of each Athlete. A written report will be produced after each session.
- Technical Advisor/Coach and USEF Director led communication, competition planning, selection methodology, logistical planning.
- Training Grants of \$5,000.00 \$20,000 for European travel per person per year (depending on single / pair / team), to be applied for with the Director of Driving. The Coach and Driving Sport Committee will approve who receives, and the level of, the grants. These grants will assist our drivers to travel to Europe in the off championship years to compete against the drivers they will compete against at the World Championship the following competition year. Grants set against medium and long term goals.

*Competing at an Advanced and/or FEI level does not imply "Elite Athlete status"; consistent success internationally does.

Selection/Identification

Selections will be made by the Selectors with advice from the Coach/Chef d'Equipe & Director of Driving. Criteria will include:

- The Elite Athlete / Horse or Pony combination must be perceived to be competitive at the next Worlds and / or next Games. As a guide;
- Depth of horse power
- The Athlete's results at 2* and above
- Ability of the Athlete to produce peak performances in conditions similar to or at Games
- Satisfactory veterinary inspection and/or report if requested by Selectors
- Agreement to Requirements of Program
- Willingness of Athlete to buy in to the aims of the Program, including facilitating effective communication between the Athletes' own support staff (trainer, vet, farrier etc.) and the Program / Team support staff.

Benefits/Support

- Access to Elite Program resources (Coach/Chef d'Equipe, Human/Horse/Pony SSM programs, USEF Staff)
- Financial support through Coaching/training grants and European grants
- Bi-annual review with Coach/Chef d'Equipe to analyze performance, deficiencies in personal program, sophisticated approach as to what is missing to get drivers to next step. Funding set against agreed Targets
- Detailed planning for Horse/Pony on a four-year cycle to target Horse/Pony to specific Games, championships and events.
- Logistical planning/resources
- Equine and Human SSM support

Requirements to Maintain Status

- Must set targets to encourage improved performance and results
- The Elite Program Members will be reviewed twice annually; those unable to show improved results will either be moved to the Developing program.
- Demonstrate involvement with Human SSM Program as available and appropriate.
- Encourage communication between support staff and USEF Driving support staff.
- Demonstrate a commitment to the aims of the Program and the Code of Conduct
- Abide by USEF Code of Conduct

Developing Program – Run by USEF (Developing Driver Program)

Identification and support on the road to the Elite Program; Coach managed with support from Driving Sport Committee

Encourage Developing Athletes/Horses to remain with their own Coach and utilize the strengths of their own program if it is effective. Test their progress at Developing Drivers training sessions to challenge and inspire them to move up the pathway and provide opportunities where appropriate. Identify certain requirements to stay on the Developing Program.

Dressage, Marathon and Cones scores need to continue to improve in each level.

- Progression on to the Elite program
- International exposure
- Underpin sustainability of Medals in the Championships

Selection/Identification

Criteria will include:

- Communication skills
- Quality of the Athlete's Horse/Pony and their perceived ability to progress up the competition levels
- Technical skills
- Trainability

- Commitment
- Mindset

Emerging Athlete Program – Run by the ADS affiliate ****UNDER DEVELOPMENT**** *Items under discussion & to be determined*

- Either a Developing driver with a new Equine, or a driver that has been identified by either someone in the DSC, or by another elite driver, Coach or Chef d'Equipe that is familiar with the requirements.
- If a new Athlete, must be competing at a minimum at the Training Level at CDEs.
- Offer bi-annual training sessions with Coaches to monitor progress and help set goals and targets
- Online and written education
- SSM Education and support as available
- Work with the ADS &/or Director of Driving, to build a training plan, which includes competitions at which the Athlete/Equine will be observe and evaluated.
- Demonstrate Potential for Developing Driver Program
- Satisfactory veterinary inspection and/or report if requested
- Agreement to Requirements of Program
- Willingness of Athlete to buy in to the aims of the Program including facilitating effective communication between the Athletes' own support staff (trainer, vet, farrier & support staff) and the Program/Support staff.
