Re: Qualifying Dates and Competitions for 2024 FEI North American Youth Championships, JR/YR

Dear Potential 2024 FEI North American Youth Championships Applicants:

This preliminary information is being provided to assist you with your competition planning. Please remember that this information is based on the recommendations of the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) Dressage Sport Committee and is subject to approval by the USEF Board of Directors and therefore subject to change. Any determined updates and documentation submission will be outlined in the NAYC Selection Procedures.

<u>SELECTION PROCESS SUMMARY</u>: Athlete/horse combinations must compete in qualifying competitions and earn scores in the Team and Individual tests (see more detail below). Ranking lists will be maintained and selection is based on the final rankings of each Region (see more detail below). The 2024 FEI North American Youth Championships is scheduled to take place on July 30th – August 4th, 2024, in Traverse City, Michigan.

1. Qualifying Period

The proposed qualifying period for the 2024 FEI North American Youth Championships will begin on July 25, 2023. It is anticipated that the qualifying period will finish at least seven days prior to the Nominated Entry date.

2. Qualifying Competitions

It is anticipated that athlete/horse combinations will be required to complete at least two Qualifying Competitions. Qualifying Competitions include:

- Competitions listed on the NAYC/USEF Qualifying Competitions Calendar (within the qualifying period): Scores earned at these competitions are automatically counted towards the Ranking List. NAYC/USEF Qualifying Competitions scheduled to take place beginning July 25, 2023 through December 31, 2023 can be found HERE. The 2024 NAYC/USEF Qualifying Competitions Calendar will be available in the Fall of 2023 HERE. Please make sure to check the Calendar(s) frequently for updates.
- <u>CDI-J or CDI-Y Events</u> (within the qualifying period): Scores earned at CDI-Y/J are calculable at the option of the athlete and will only be computed into the Ranking List upon receipt of a CDI & Championship Report Form within the specified deadline stated on the form (Form can be found at www.usdf.org). The 2023 and 2024 FEI Calendars can be found on the FEI website HERE (Please note that the FEI 2024 calendar is not approved until after the FEI General Assembly in November). Please make sure to check the Calendar(s) frequently for updates. Scores from the 2023 NAYC will not be counted.



- Regional Championships (within the qualifying period): It is anticipated for FEI Junior and FEI Young Riders to be able to earn qualifying scores in their FEI division USEF/USDF Regional Championship classes in the FEI Team Test. This is only applicable for those qualified to compete in the Regional Championship classes; qualifying information for Regional Championships can be found on the USDF website HERE. In order for these scores to count, scores must be reported by athletes via the CDI & Championship Report Form by the deadlines as indicated on the form. In cases where the USDF Regional Championship is already a designated NAYC/USEF Qualifying Competition, scores earned in FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider Qualifying classes are automatically recorded. This means that an athlete may report their score from the Regional Championship Jr and/or YR Team Championship class(es) as an additional (second) team score.
- <u>USEF Young Rider or Junior Dressage National Championships</u> (within the qualifying period): Scores earned at these National Championships are calculable at the option of the athlete and will only be computed into the Ranking List upon receipt of a CDI & Championship Report Form within the specified deadline stated on the form.
- 3. Tests Required: It is anticipated that athlete/horse combinations will be required to achieve two scores in the current editions of their respective FEI Junior Team Test/FEI Young Rider Team Test and two scores in the current editions of the FEI Junior Individual Test/FEI Young Rider Individual Tests. Athlete/horse combinations that achieve more than two scores in the relevant Team or Individual test, may drop the lowest score earned in the Team Test and the Individual Test, regardless of whether these scores were earned in the same Qualifying Competition. Regardless of the number of scores achieved, rider will only be permitted to drop the lowest Individual Test score and the lowest Team Test score. Athletes wishing to qualify for the Junior Championship must qualify with FEI Junior Tests and Athletes wishing to qualify for the Young Rider Championship must qualify with FEI Young Rider Tests.
- 4. <u>Certificate of Capability</u>: Each athlete/horse combination must earn a Certificate of Capability by attaining a minimum overall average of 64.000% or greater attributed by a panel of two (2) or more USEF 'S' or FEI Judges, in the FEI Team Test and FEI Individual Test at two (2) different qualifying competitions. A minimum overall average of 64% or greater will be required in order to be named to the nominated and definite entries. In addition to these tests, athlete/horse combinations will be required to earn one score of 65% or higher in the respective FEI Junior Freestyle test or FEI Young Rider Freestyle test. Scores achieved from Test of Choice classes cannot be counted towards the Certificate of Capability.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

<u>Application of Intent</u>: An Application of Intent is required to be submitted in order to be eligible for this Championship. An application is considered to be submitted once the email acknowledgement has been received from USDF. The Application of Intent will be available no later than January 1, 2024. Qualifying scores may be earned prior to submission of Application of Intent.

<u>Certificate of Domicile:</u> As a part of the application of intent, every athlete or parent/guardian if the athlete is a minor shall complete and submit a Certificate of Domicile. An athlete may have only one domicile, which is where the rider has his permanent home and where, whenever he is absent, intends to return. A minor's domicile follows that of the parent or guardian who has lawful custody of the minor (unless the minor is emancipated from their parent/guardian). A minor is any athlete that has not yet reached his 18th birthday as of January 1, 2024. More information regarding the Certificate of Domicile will be published in the Selection Procedures for the event.

USEF Safe Sport: Athletes will be responsible for abiding by the USEF Safe Sport Policy, including the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. Any Athlete age 18 or older will be required to undergo a background screen in accordance with the current USEF Background Check Policy contained in the <u>USEF Safe Sport Policy</u>. Any Athlete age 18 or older as of the conclusion of the Championships will be required to remain current with the U.S. Center for SafeSport's education and training requirements in accordance with <u>USEF Safe Sport Policy</u>.

FEI Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE): It is recommended that you review any medications you are taking through the GlobalDRO.com in the presence of the prescribing provider and review and submit specific TUE documentation, if applicable. A TUE application can be found online at https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/humans/tues, or contact Steven Morrissey at USEF (smorrissey@usef.org). TUEs must be completed and submitted to the FEI at least 30 days prior to participating in an FEI event.

Equine Anti-Doping: Please be reminded that all horses that are registered with the FEI or USEF shall be subject to in-competition testing. Please work with your FEI veterinarian for compliance. More information on the FEI Prohibited substance database can be found on the FEI website HERE.

<u>Grievances:</u> Athletes wishing to file a grievance challenging a denial or threatened denial to participate in competition, please see the Athlete's Guide to Filing a Grievance Regarding Opportunity to Participate and Grievance Form. <u>Equipment</u>: Per DR121, snaffle bridles will be permitted for NAYC qualifying classes, USEF Junior qualifying classes and USEF Young Rider qualifying classes. **If you are competing in a CDI and/or at NAYC, FEI Rules apply.**
