I thought the tracks rode well. I felt I built the 3 star quite big and wide this week in the run up to Rolex, however I had more clean than I anticipated. I thought the questions were technical enough and the general consensus from riders/trainers walking the course was it was a tough track. I do think the excellent footing combined with the show jumping before xc had an effect on the amount of clear rounds. The time allowed was in my opinion one of my most accurate especially for this event. It was a touch on the tight side but I think it was necessary in this ring and for this track. It was interesting to see that One group of Advanced (over the same track) had time faults but the second division of Advanced and the three star did not.

I thought the one star and two star had good results. Again, the horses seemed to jump well and dealt with the arena atmosphere well.
