Interested in Becoming a Licensed Official?

Individuals can apply to become a licensed official for combined driving competitions and serve in different roles. Give back to the sport as a judge, technical delegate, or course designer. The requirements to become a national licensed official are located in the <u>Licensed Officials Policies and Procedures</u>, which includes updated expedited application options for current Athletes competing at the Advanced or CAI2* levels. <u>Learn more about becoming a national or FEI combined driving official here.</u>

USEF Warning Card System

As of April 1, 2025, the new USEF Warning Card System went into effect. The Warning Card System rule was amended to encourage and empower Judges, Stewards, and Technical Delegates to address conduct as it happens and correct behavior that should not be repeated. As part of the revision of this rule, USEF focused on clarity and flexibility by streamlining the existing Yellow Warning Card process and adding a Recorded Warning process to provide a mechanism for addressing less egregious behavior.

The goal of the revised warning system is to have conduct addressed and documented immediately, be it an infraction that rises to the level of a Yellow Warning Card or is less severe and warrants a Recorded Warning.

The Quest To End Laminitis Continues thanks to the Grayson Jockey Club Research Foundation



Laminitis is a disease in which the tissues that attach the hoof to the underlying coffin bone become damaged and inflamed. It can be devastating for both horse and owner. It not only leads to loss of performance but is second to colic as the biggest cause of premature death in horses. Dr. Andrew Van Eps, the Dean W. Richardson Professor of Equine Disease Research at the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine, has conducted multiple projects funded by Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation that have focused on understanding the mechanisms that lead to laminitis in different situations and evaluation of distal limb cooling (cryotherapy) as a preventative and treatment.
