

## JUDGE'S CHECKLIST FOR A TURNOUT CLASS AND LINEUP

In all Turnout classes the judge must walk the line up, inspect each entry and ask for the rein back.

## **GENERAL FOR THE LINEUP**

- 1. Overall impression of the quality of the turnout throughout the class both on the rail and in the lineup
- 2. Overall condition of the entire turnout
- 3. Appropriate fit of the harness and vehicle to the horse
- 4. When checking for spares and appointments, make sure they are appropriate and clean
- 5. Does the seat upholstery color and material compliment the vehicle
- 6. Check the attire of whip/driver, passengers and grooms for neatness and appropriateness
- 7. Are their clothes clean and neat/wrinkle free, or does the driver have dirty shoes/boots, clothes
- 8. Does the driver's hat or helmet fit properly and complimentary to the turnout
- 9. Does the lap robe fit properly and complimentary to the turnout
- 8. Is their hair neat or messy; can you see their entry number well

## Remember:

- This class is judged primarily on the condition and fit of turnout; the vehicle, the harness, appointments, horse(s) and people 70%
- Only 30% is judged on the performance, manners, and way of going.

## **REIN BACK IN THE LINEUP**

To be performed in two parts in the lineup:

- 1. The horse(s) must move backward at least 4 steps in an unhurried manner with head flexed and straight (watch the horse's hips). Count strides from the front legs of the horse(s)
- 2. Move forward willingly to former position using the same quiet aids (always wait until the entry has returned to its original position before moving onto the next turnout)
- 3. Observe how the fit of the harness and the fit of the vehicle respond. Is everything fitting like a glove, or is it sloppy and interfering with the horse(s) performance
