Re: Anticipated Selection Methods for the 2025 FEI World Endurance Young Rider Championship

This preliminary information is provided to assist you with your competition planning and is subject to change. Please remember that this information is based upon the recommendations of the USEF Endurance Sport Committee and is subject to approval by the USEF Board of Directors or USEF Executive Committee and therefore subject to change upon the approval of the final Selection Procedures by the USEF Board of Directors or USEF Executive Committee.

The 2025 FEI World Endurance Young Rider Championship (Championship) are expected to be held in Buftea, ROU from September 20, 2025.

Selection Methodology: Please be advised that the proposed Selection Period for the 2025 U.S. Endurance Young Rider World Championship Team selection process will begin on September 1, 2023 and is anticipated to end June 2, 2025 (subject to confirmation of the Championship dates). Please note that Selection Events are defined as any single day Endurance Event held at 120km or longer that is FEI sanctioned and/or USEF Licensed and has been designated by the Athlete in advance in accordance with the details below. A competition is not considered a Selection Event until USEF confirms that the designation has been received before the deadline and it meets the requirements for a Selection Event for the Athlete/Horse Combination.

It is anticipated that the Athlete/Horse combinations named to the U.S. Endurance Team for the Championship will be based on the Ranking Formula described in detail within Attachment A. In order to be included on the Ranking List, Athlete/Horse Combinations must designate in writing to the USEF Director of Endurance at least two (2) and no more than four (4) Selection Events during the Selection Period at least fourteen (14) days prior to the published start of each competition.

The Athlete/Horse Combination's best two (2) results from their Designated Selection Events, will be used to calculate the points utilized for the Ranking List. Of these best two (2) Selection Events used for the Ranking List, the Athlete/Horse Combination must successfully complete at least one designated Selection Event at least 200 radial miles from the other designated selection event. Therefore, the Athlete/Horse combination must successfully complete at least two (2) designated selection events, which are 200 radial miles from one another.

NOTE: If an Athlete designates a Selection Event and crosses the start line but does not complete the competition, the Selection Event will still count as one of the maximum four permitted Selection Events. If an Athlete designates a Selection Event but does not cross the start line at the competition, the Selection

Event will not count as one of the maximum four permitted Selection Events.

NOTE: For purposes of this selection memo, the definition of complete is to finish all phases of the competition and pass the final veterinary inspection at the competition without receiving a failure to qualify (includes elimination), disqualification, retirement, rider option following the combination crossing the start line (does not include withdrawal at or prior to the first pre-ride inspection). Finished Not Ranked (FNR) is considered a completion.

Additional selection criteria may be added in the full Selection Procedures.

Veterinary Examination: The 2025 U.S. Endurance Team horses will be required to pass at least one (1) USEF designated Team veterinary examination. Details to be confirmed in 2025.

FEI Qualifying: The Athlete, Horse owner, and Horse must comply with FEI Rules for the Championship, including but not limited to the FEI Qualifying Requirements, which can be found on the FEI Website prior to the start of the Championship.

Funding: The availability of funding is subject to confirmation of the 2025 budget.

Athlete/Horse Combinations will be ranked based on the following formula. The Championship Selection Ranking will be updated as results are available and published on the USEF website:

2025 SELECTION RANKING FORMULA:

Format: D + E + P + T = Event Ranking Score Formula:

1. Distance = "D"
2. Event Type = "E"
3. Placement = "P"
4. Time = "T"

DISTANCE POINTS ("D"): Based upon successful completion at FEI or USEF Licensed Competition distances:

1. 160km = 160 Points
2. 140km = 140 Points
3. 120km = 120 Points

Note: Results at events with 4 or fewer overall Starters will receive 50% of Distance ("D") points only.*

COMPETITION RATING ("E"): These bonus multipliers may be combined:

1. USEF Endurance National Championship or Test Event: +0.50*D
2. CEI: +0.25*D
3. Best Condition in CEI or USEF Licensed Event(s): +0.25*D
4. USEF National Licensed Ride (NOT a CEI Event): +0.25*D
5. USEF Zone Championship: +0.25*D

Note: FNR results receiving successful completion, Distance ("D") points ONLY. No Event Rating multiplier will apply.

PLACEMENT ("P"): Points will be awarded to the Athlete/Horse Combinations who complete** as stated below, relative to the total number of overall starters* at that distance, whether at FEI or USEF Licensed Competitions: Placement Points will be determined based upon the Athlete/Horse Combination's overall 'Order of Finish' in the relevant Distance at the Competition, at the same distance and on the same day.

1. Award of Placement Points:

- a. Applicable to Top 5 overall Finishers regardless of type of entry (Young Rider, Senior Rider, USEF or FEI) at the relevant Distance. Ranking Score will be based upon the largest field;
- b. Minimum of 5 overall Starters* or no Placement Points will be awarded;
- c. Top 5 must successfully complete/finish** within 60 minutes of Winner
- d. Placement Point Calculation Formula:

(1) (Number of overall starters divided by overall placing) x 10 = "P"

(2) Examples:

(a) (12 starters/2nd Place Overall) x 10 = 60

(b) (5 Starters/1st Place Overall) x 10 = 50

TIME ("T"): Time will be calculated to the nearest whole minute, ie: if 2 finish times are recorded as 8:49:09, and 8:49:49, they will be both be accounted for as 8:49.

1. 160 km Event: 60 Points for Finishing at Winning time, then loss of 1 point/minute for later finishers, who must finish within 60 minutes of Winning time. "0" points for finishing beyond 60 minutes; or,
2. 140 km Event: 45 Points for Finishing at Winning time, then loss of 1 point/minute for later finishers, who must finish within 45 minutes of Winning time. "0" points for finishing beyond 45

- minutes; or,
3. 120 km Event: 30 Points for Finishing at Winning time, then loss of 1 point/minute for later finishers, who must finish within 40 minutes of Winning time. "0" points for finishing beyond 30 minutes.

TIES:

1. Ties will be broken based on the best final time from the best designated selection event being used for the ranking list for each Athlete/Horse combination.
2. If a tie persists, any tie will be broken based upon the best single FEI competition Ranking Score for each Athlete/Horse Combination within the FEI qualification period.
3. If a tie persists, any tie will be decided by discretionary selection between the tied Athlete/Horse Combinations by the Endurance Chef d'Equipe for the Championship.

CHANGES: If, in the course of the selection process, USEF discovers or determines an ambiguity or gap exists in this document, its CEO may alter or amend this document to address such issues.

*Overall Starters for the purposes of this Ranking List will be defined as number of combinations to cross the start line in any division of the same distance at the same competition.

**Complete for the purposes of this Ranking List will be defined as finishing all phases of the competition and passing the final veterinary inspection at the competition without receiving a failure to qualify (includes elimination), disqualification, retirement, rider option following the combination crossing the start line (does not include withdrawal at or prior to the first pre-ride inspection). Finished Not Ranked (FNR) is considered a completion.
