Recent Announcements

FEI CES Assessment & Officiating Maintenance Requirements:

All FEI Officials must complete the online Competency-based Evaluation System (CES) online assessment by March 31, 2023, in order to officiate after March 31. Read more about the FEI CES here (FEI Competency-based Evaluation System (CES)). If a CES assessment is not completed in 2023, the license function will be closed.

The FEI will review officiating maintenance requirements for the 2025 competition year. Therefore, you must be up to date on any officiating maintenance requirements by December 15, 2024. The FEI will review officiating records within the previous three years (2022, 2023 and 2024). It is an official's responsibility to understand the officiating maintenance requirements and plan to officiate accordingly in 2023 and 2024.

2023 Dressage Tests:

The new Dressage tests for 2023 from Introductory Level through Fourth Level, Developing Horse, and Freestyle are now available. These tests are effective as of December 1, 2022 and are replacing the 2019 tests. The new Dressage tests can be found on the <u>USDF Website</u>.

FEI Dressage, Eventing, Jumping, and Vaulting Officials:

Did you know that you can participate in an official's club for your discipline? The International Dressage Officials Club (IDOC), International Eventing Officials Club (IEOC), International Jumping Officials Club (IJOC), and International Vaulting Officials Club (IVOC) are all MOU Stakeholders with the FEI. Participation in a club can give a voice to officials with the FEI, provide the opportunity to exchange ideas, and share experiences within the sport.

Jumper Judge Mentor Program:

Do you like to teach? The newly approved Mentor Program for Jumper Judge applicants started December 1, 2022, and USEF is looking for individuals to serve as Mentors. Mentors are responsible for assisting applicants through the application process and apprenticing. 'R' Jumper Judges interested in becoming a Mentor should review and complete the application.

Rule & Policy Changes

2023 P&P & LID Updates:

The 2023 Licensed Official Policies and Procedures (P&P) became effective on December 1, 2022. Please note, the maintenance requirements for the following licenses were updated: C1 Steward, Combined Driving TD, Hackney/Roadster/Saddlebred, Hunter CD, Saddle Seat Equitation, Shetland, and Western. Please be mindful of the changes to the maintenance requirements moving forward as it is an official's responsibility to ensure compliance with the applicable maintenance requirements.

The <u>FEI Licensing Information Document (LID)</u> was updated on November 29, 2022. **Any U.S. official interested in applying for FEI licensure must complete the U.S. requirements within the LID in addition to the FEI's requirements.**

Rule Changes:

The 2023 Rulebook is posted, and a variety of rule changes went into effect December 1, 2022. Please review the Rulebook for accuracy before officiating during the 2023 competition year. For more details regarding the Rulebook or other rule changes click here. Review the 2023 Rulebook here.

COVID-19 Action Plan:

A new edition of the USEF COVID-19 Action Plan went into effect December 9, 2022. The updated version now defers to state, local, and CDC guidelines for any

recommendations to protect competition participants from COVID-19, although competition management may implement additional protocols if they desire. Please note that a Presidential Modification for dressage rules related to COVID-19 adjustments was approved for the 2023 competition year.

New clinics are being added on a regular basis for the 2023 competition year. Tools to Use

Steward & TD Reports:

To collect detailed information with regards to facilities, footing, stabling and competition safety, the Federation amended questions included in the section "Standards for Management and Facilities." Steward and TD reports are an integral part of the evaluation of each competition. Updates made to all 2023 Reports and worksheets can be viewed, downloaded, or printed here. Please review the report prior to officiating, and contact the Competition Reports Coordinator at reports@usef.org with any questions.

Name Badge Order Form:

National Stewards and Technical Delegates may order additional USEF Steward or TD Name Badges by filling out the <u>Name Badge Order Form</u>. Newly licensed Stewards and TDs will continue to automatically receive one set of badges for free. No order form is required.

LO Applications

All National and FEI applicants must start an online licensed official application checklist before starting the licensing process. If you complete any National requirements prior to starting an online application those requirements will not count.

Would you like to become a USEF licensed official?

Would you like to become an FEI Licensed Official?

Please review the <u>FEI Licensing Information Document</u> as well as the <u>FEI Official's Page</u> for each discipline's specific licensing requirements.

If you are ready to start the application process for either a National or FEI License:

- 1. Login to your My USEF account.
- 2. Select the Licensed Officials Dashboard tile.
- 3. Select the Licensed Officials Application tile.
- 4. Click the "Start New Checklist" button.
- 5. Your eligibility requirements will be confirmed by USEF and/or the respective Affiliate.
- 6. Once your eligibility requirements are confirmed, check back on the status of your application by following steps 1-3.
