For permitted saddlery, USEF Eventing refers to the <u>FEI Eventing Rules</u> and <u>FEI TackApp</u>, if it is not covered in Subchapter EV-10. Please see below for exceptions from the FEI Rules for USEF licensed/Endorsed Eventing competitions for the national levels.
