AGENT DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT - KEY COMPONENTS

- Statements
 - o Example:
 - What are agent's specific responsibilities and obligations with respect to acting on behalf of the buyer/seller?
 - Does the agent have buyer's/seller's documented requirements for purchase/sale?
- Compensation
 - Example:
 - What is the commission rate of compensation for the agent(s)?
 - Who is responsible for paying the agent(s)?
 - When does the agent(s) get paid their commission, and how will the payment(s) be made?
- Disclosures
 - o Example:
 - Does the agent have prior relationships with either the horse or other party that should be disclosed in the transaction?
- Dual agency
 - o Example:
 - Are both the buyer and seller aware that the agent represents both parties, or a third party?
- Governing Law
 - Example:
 - Under which state's laws will the contract be interpreted if there is legal action as a result of the contract?

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
