The <u>2026 USEF Combined Driving National Championship criteria</u>, developed by the Driving Sport Committee and approved by the USEF Board of Directors, outlines eligibility, class offerings, and organizational requirements for host venues. While athletes and horses/ponies who do not meet the specified criteria may still compete in associated classes, they will not be eligible for National Championship placings (see DC 928.2.1.2 for participation guidelines).

Interested in Becoming a Licensed Official?

Individuals can apply to become a licensed official for combined driving competitions and serve in different roles. Give back to the sport as a judge, technical delegate, or course designer. The requirements to become a national licensed official are located in the <u>Licensed Officials Policies and Procedures</u>, which includes updated expedited application options for current Athletes competing at the Advanced or CAI2* levels. USEF Warning Card System

As of April 1, 2025, the new USEF Warning Card System went into effect. The Warning Card System rule was amended to encourage and empower Judges, Stewards, and Technical Delegates to address conduct as it happens and correct behavior that should not be repeated. As part of the revision of this rule, USEF focused on clarity and flexibility by streamlining the existing Yellow Warning Card process and adding a Recorded Warning process to provide a mechanism for addressing less egregious behavior.

The goal of the revised warning system is to have conduct addressed and documented immediately, be it an infraction that rises to the level of a Yellow Warning Card or is less severe and warrants a Recorded Warning.



Project Update: A Novel DNA Vaccine Platform to Control EHV-1 and EHV-4



Equine herpesvirus type-1 (EHV-1) and EHV-4 cause respiratory disease in horses and both viruses can initiate abortions in pregnant mares. EHV-1 also causes neurologic disease, known as equine herpesvirus myeloencephalopathy (EHM). EHM outbreaks continue throughout the United States despite several available EHV vaccines. The medical and economic impact of EHV-1 and EHM outbreaks on the equine industry is substantial through lost training and competing time, costs related to quarantine, treatment, and loss of horses due to death of severely neurologic existing EHV-1 vaccines do not induce a strong memory response, and therefore require regular boosters to supplement their effects. In addition, there is not an adequate vaccine available for young horses to protect them from the virus early in life. But thanks to the Grayson Jockey Club Research Foundation vaccine research is currently being conducted, read more here:
