Young Event Horse mission

The USEA Young Event Horse (YEH) program was designed to identify young horses ages four and five, that possess the talent and disposition to, with proper training, excel at the 4-star and 5-star levels of eventing. Qualifying competitions include a dressage test and jumping/galloping test, whereas Championships also include a conformation test.

The USEA continuously tracks all YEH graduate horses and highlights their success at the upper levels throughout their lifespan, across various media channels. YEH horses also receive special promotions when they participate in five-star and U.S. Team events.

Grant Opportunities

The Holekamp/Turner Grant provides a YEH Championship competitor with the opportunity to represent the United States at the FEI Eventing World Breeding Championships in the 7-year-old CCIYH3*-L Championship at Mondial du Lion in Le Lion d'Angers,

France each year. A large cash grant is awarded with the purpose of paving a clear pathway for U.S. team horses to progress in the sport of eventing. For more information, visit this [page](#).

Developing Horse Series

Principles

- USEF Six-, Seven-, Eight-, and Nine-Year Old Developing Horse Series is to identify horses with the perceived ability to eventually contribute to the Elite Program and achieve podium scores within three quadrennials.
- The Series is based on Team Championship

preparation and success.

- The Series is overseen by the Director, Eventing Development Programs, Gemma Stobbs

Outline

- Six-Year-Olds will use their two lowest scores from December to June- all CCI1* and CCI2*s and then July to November- all CCI2*s.
- Seven-Year-Olds will use their two lowest scores will be from December to June- all CCI2*s and CCI3*s, and then July to November- all CCI3*s.
- Eight and Nine-Year-Olds will use their two lowest recorded finishing score at a CCI4*- S, CCI4*-L or CCI5*-L event from January 1-December 31.
- All CCIs within the respective timelines and applicable levels will be

included in the standings. It will be encouraged for competitions to run separate YH divisions.

Recognition

- Athletes, horses and owners will be recognized following the last FEI competition of the season.
- Owners will receive a pin in recognition of their horse's achievements. With the hopes that they will be able to have a collection as the horse progresses up the levels.
