The Driving Sport Committee met at the 2020 USEF Annual Meeting in West Palm Beach, Fla. on January 9, to discuss various driving sport programs and initiatives. The meeting agenda covered various topics to move the sport forward into 2020.

The Committee will be creating a position of Driving Technical Advisor as a part-

Besides the benefit of having more events locally, drivers could have access to additional recognition at all levels – for instance, special awards for drivers under the age of 25 (U25). USEF also recognizes the need to build a pathway for competitions to develop regional events into large-scale licensed competitions, if the possibility is there. These new products will roll out in a pilot program before the end of 2020. Another new initiative that the Committee is taking on is building the foundation of the USEF Athlete Pathway Programs: the **Emerging Driver Program**. While this program will underpin the Developing and Elite Athlete Programs, it will function
