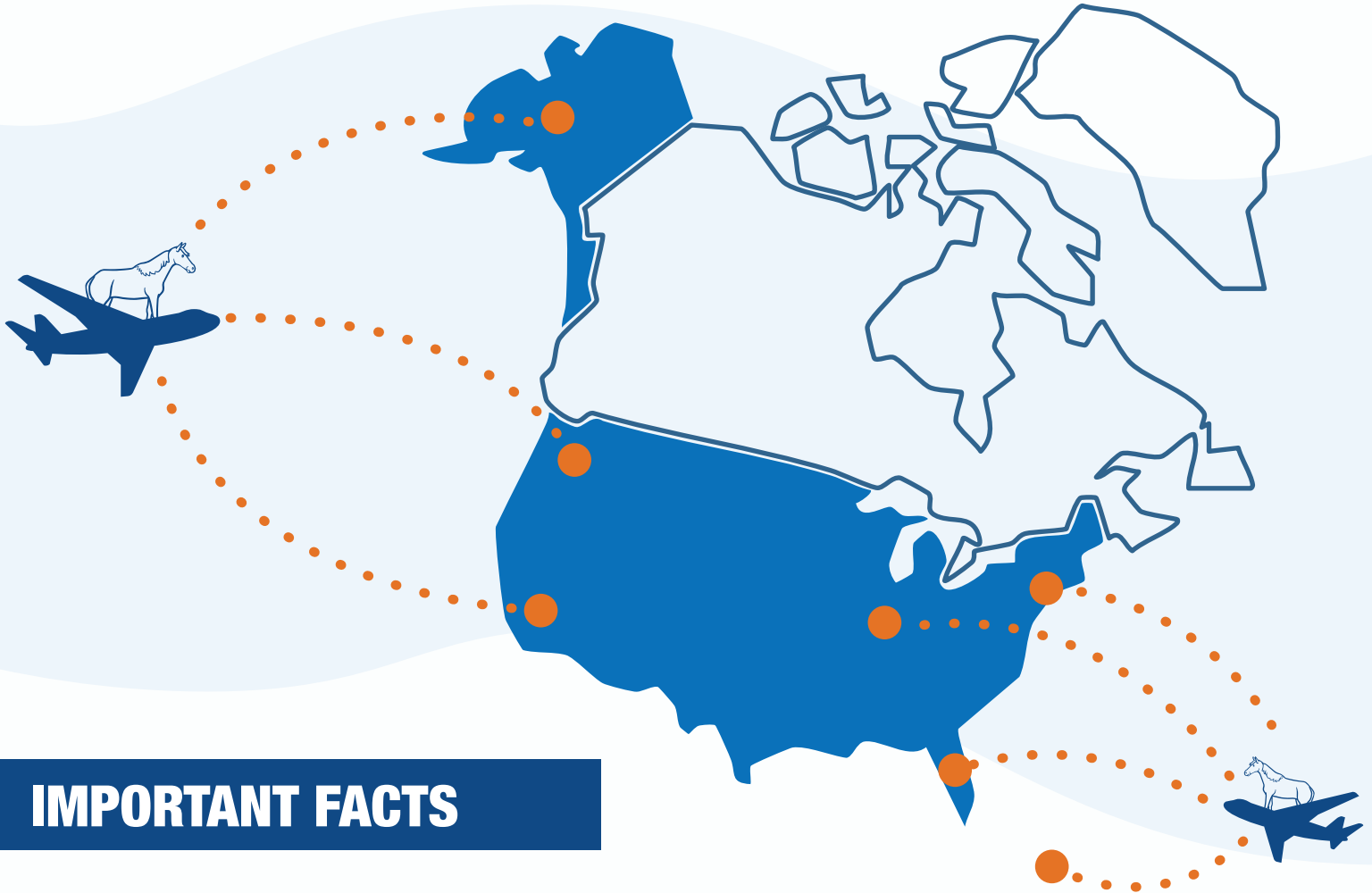




Horses recently imported to the United States are unlikely to be vaccinated for local and regional diseases prior to importation.



IMPORTANT FACTS

- Horses DO NOT get vaccinated while in USDA quarantine
- It is recommended that all imported horses be evaluated and appropriately vaccinated by a veterinarian immediately upon release from USDA quarantine. Multiple doses may be required to achieve adequate protection.

CORE VACCINES

Core vaccinations protect against diseases that are endemic to a region, are virulent/highly contagious, pose a risk of severe disease, have potential public health significance, and/or are required by law. **Core Vaccines recommended for ALL horses residing in the United States include:**



- Eastern & Western Equine Encephalomyelitis (EEE and WEE)
- West Nile Virus
- Tetanus
- Rabies
